Leader:

We come together to seek the Mind of Christ.

Response:

We are His Church, belonging to Him and each other

We are the Body of which He is Head.

Leader:

We are a people in Covenant together

Response:

Committed to live in loving community

Preferring each other's needs to our own

Leader:

We are the people of God

Response:

We desire to know His purpose;

We seek His face together;

Leader:

We are called to reflect his likeness,

To reveal His nature through our shared deliberations
To mirror His image in the community that we forge
To pursue His Kingdom in initiatives we develop
To sense His presence in the discourse we share.

Response:

We come. Believing that through His Spirit, the living Christ will speak

To influence and shape every plan and idea that we might devise

To equip us in carrying them out,

To be alorified in our shared endeavours

Leader:

This is not a seat of human democracy Where every voice demands its hearing

Every opinion its right to be aired

And every proposition needs to withstand human challenge

This is not a chamber of debate

Where polished argument takes precedent

Over faltering thoughts and ideas which are still being formed.

Where those for whom speech comes quickly and easily Have any greater right to be heard Than those who struggle to express in words The yearnings and concerns of their heart.

This is a place where the well-rehearsed proposition Sits, side by side, with that intuitive shadow of an idea Whose form eludes definition in words and reason alone And yet whose outline might be traced by the Spirit's hand

Response:

This is a place of divine encounter Where sensing His presence

Matters more than proving our point

Where the whisper of the Divine

A place of listening to the Spirit Rather than voicing human opinion

Leader:

How does God speak?

Response:

He speaks through His people, His Body on earth

Leader:

He speaks through the carefully considered and well-made presentation

Response:

He speaks through the chance thought of a sister or brother

Leader:

He speaks through those things that lie heavy on our hearts

Response:

He speaks through the gathering pace of a shared idea

Leader:

He speaks through the coincidence of a common ideal

He speaks through the silence when no-one has a view to share The stillness in which we plumb the depths of new realisation

Response:

He speaks through His Word

He speaks through our prayers

He speaks through our mistakes and disappointments

He speaks through our laughter He speaks through our tears

Leader:

Loving God Eternal Word

Our concern is not the mouthpiece that you choose

Or the means by which You express it But that we might encounter You afresh

And be conscious not of having made decisions

So much as having discovered that which you have chosen to reveal
