

Why disability inclusion is so important

Christian charity Through the Roof produced a series of vdeos and shorts for Disability Awareness Sunday last month. One set features Helen Cameron (President of the Methodist Conference, Moderator of the UK Free Churches Group and President of CTE) in a series of five videos about church disability inclusion. The second set, on the theme 'Journey with Jesus' was created from an interview with Baptist minister Andrew Miles - a hospital chaplain and wheelchair user, who has an assistance dog. These videos are worth sharing with your church when discussing accessibility and inclusion.



Share Jesus International (SJI) - Sharing Jesus Quiz

SJI has commissioned research to better understand how practising Christians in the UK share their faith. The research identified four main tensions when it comes to faith sharing. Tension around whether faith sharing starts with the message or the person; is done personally or corporately; is done in word or action; and is understood with a concluding moment or as part of an ongoing journey. These tensions are based on everyday attitudes and highlight that there is no one way of doing things. Using the tensions, six faith sharing styles have been developed and an online quiz is available to enable Christians to discover how they tend to share their faith. The profiles affirm and celebrate some aspects whilst also giving each person a 'stretch' or something to develop. Click here to access the quiz.



Homelessness Sunday

Christian homelessness charity Housing Justice is organising Homelessness Sunday on Sunday 6 October – the Sunday before World Homeless Day. Through exploring the trauma Jesus experienced as he anticipated the cross he opens up neglected themes in the gospels' account of Jesus' agony in the garden of Gethsemane, illuminating questions of justice and identity.
